The 9th U.S.-China Health Summit

【Background】

2019 is a unique year for several reasons. First, it marks the 40th anniversary of the signing of the 1979 Health Protocol between the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) of the U.S. and the Ministry of Health (MOH) of China for cooperation in the science and technology of medicine and public health (*CTIA Document No. 2548.030*), which was subsequently renewed in 2009. In the renewed document, it was stated that the protocol was “*for the purpose of promoting cooperation and the exchange of information in the field of health, Recognizing the importance of progress in the health sciences and health administration for the quality of life for all people; Desiring to fully share advances in the field of health of benefit to the peoples of both countries*”.

Over the past forty years, the two countries had worked closely in training, research and field work to address global challenges of infectious diseases and to share experiences in managing noncommunicable diseases and climate change. Under this protocol, many clinical doctors and healthcare policy makers have been trained in major universities of the U.S. including Harvard University. They are now playing major roles in the forefront of global health, biomedical research, healthcare policy and service delivery in China.

Second, 2019 is also marked as the ten-year anniversary of the Chinese Health Care Reform ten years ago with the U.S. Obama Care initiated in the following year of 2010. The U.S.-China Health Summit was inaugurated in 2011. “*Health officials from China and the United States gathered at Harvard to examine successful reforms around the world and to exchange information on their own efforts, as the two global giants seek ways to extend access, improve quality, and lower the cost of care to their citizens.*” The Harvard Newspaper Gazette reported then “*The conference opened with twin keynote addresses by Assistant Secretary for Planning and Evaluation at the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services Sherry Glied and Chinese Minister of Health Chen Zhu.*” (<https://news.harvard.edu/gazette/story/2011/09/improving-health-care-in-china-u-s/>)

Since then, the annual U.S.-China Health Summit has been held alternated between the U.S. and China with hundreds or thousands of participants ranging from academia, health care providers, policy makers and industry leaders. We are very honored that many preeminent leaders in healthcare and medical research accepted our invitation to deliver keynote speeches and talks in the Boston Summit. They are the Former Health Minister of China Wenkang Zhang, the Vice President of Chinese Academy of Engineering and the President of Chinese Academy of Medical Sciences (CAMS) & Peking Union Medical College (PUMC) Chen Wang, President of Mass General Hospital (MGH) Peter Slavin, President of China Medical Board Lincoln Chen, and the famous Chinese Scholar at Harvard University Ezra Vogel, the Vice President of Wuhan University and the Dean of Wuhan Medical School Qizhu Tang, among others.

We strongly believe that health and health care are basic human right without boundary. Keeping open dialog in health and humanity between the U.S. and China as well as among other countries can only provide mutual benefits to their people. For that sake, your participation and support will be very important to keeping the doors of dialog and collaboration open.

We look forward to seeing you, our old and new friends at both the Boston Summit in September 26-27 and the Wuhan Summit in November 1-3, 2019. Let’s work together to find out better and innovative solutions to build more sustainable health care systems between the two countries and around the world!
